Major Area of work and ICTs/Digital Innovations used	Indicate the area of work of your practice (horticulture, fisheries, forestry, etc.) and the ICTs used (applications, specific technologies or software, etc.)

Does the problem/the challenge have gender aspect?
How does it work – development of ICT used	What was the role of all participants of the process? Please describe the whole system: what people and the equipment (technologies) do in your practice? Who is responsible for all the components of the practice? Clarify the origin of the information used for your ICT tool. This section allows you to provide detail of every different practical step that was carried out to implement the practice. Do not hesitate to include trial and error! You can also include technical details here.
Feedback from users	Was there the opportunity to get feedback from users? Were these taken into consideration to modify what was developed?
Results / Impact	What changed after the implementation of the practice? What changes did you see in the livelihoods of the target group? What could be expected in the longer term? Please provide numbers where possible.

	Was the impact different for various social groups (by age, gender, income, etc.)? Any exact and precise data and numbers are most welcome.
Innovation	Was there a technical innovation?
Success factors	Why was your practice successful? What distinguishes it from similar practices? What (externally) contributed to the success?
Constraints	What were the challenges you encountered implementing the practice? What challenges were encountered by the beneficiaries of the practice? How were the challenges addressed? Does your ICT tool still have constraints you would like to address in the future?
Advice for your future followers (lessons learned)	Please describe what would you recommend to those who will try to replicate your success. Describe lessons learned from the implementation of the practice that you think are important to share with the Community of Practice. Would you do anything differently if implementing this practice again?
Sustainability	Is your practice sustainable (socially, economically, and environmentally)? Is your practice socially beneficial, how is it proved? Is it economically sound? Will it require any external funding at some point? Is it environmentally friendly?
Replicability and upscaling	Has this practice been replicated? Was it in the same context? What should be adapted in order to be able to replicate in other contexts? What should be done to enable the replication of this practice at a larger scale? Please describe conditions that must be met to replicate the practice in terms of: - Infrastructure/Access - Education/Skills - Finance/Investment - Natural conditions - Any other
Farmers' story	Insert a short testimony of a beneficiary of the use of ICTs
conclusion	Conclude specifying/explaining the impact and usefulness of the practice.
Contact	Name of contact, title, organization, email address
Websites and other resources	List other resources such as documents, websites, videos, ...etc Provide links where possible
Pictures	Please provide 3 or 4 high-resolution pictures with credits and a caption. If available you can also share graphics

- A good practice is not only a practice that is good, but also one that has been proven to work well and produce good results in different settings or contexts, and is therefore recommended as a model. It is a successful experience that has been tested and validated, in the broad sense, has been repeated and deserves to be shared, so that a greater number of people can adopt it. (FAO, 2016)
- A promising practice has demonstrated a high degree of success in its single setting, and the possibility of replication in the same setting is guaranteed. It has generated some quantitative data showing positive outcomes over a period of time. A promising practice has the potential to become a good practice, but it has not been thoroughly analysed nor has it been replicated sufficiently to support wider adoption or upscaling. As such, a promising practice incorporates a process of continuous learning and improvement. (FAO, 2016)
